EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2: 21-23

Second Reading: Colossians 3: 1-5, 9-11

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

FOCUS: We are to seek the things that are eternal.

Today's Scriptures draw our attention away from the passing things of this world and toward the things of heaven. We gather on this, the Lord's Day, to turn our hearts and minds toward Christ as we celebrate his loving presence in our midst and the hope of life eternal.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading from Ecclesiastes, we hear, Vanity of vanities ... all things are vanity! Paul encourages the Colossians to think on the things of heaven and the possibility of new life in Christ for all.
