**READINGS FOR SUNDAY AUGUST 21, 2022  
TWENTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Isaiah 66: 18-21

Second Reading: Hebrews 12: 5-7, 11-13

Gospel: Luke 13: 22-30

**FOCUS:** We strive to be faithful always.

The liturgy today gives us a chance to step back and think of our journey as disciples. This journey is not a short sprint, but a marathon. Its urgency is always there. The narrow gate is always there. But we are not alone, and we have food for the journey. Our Eucharistic celebration strengthens us and gives us the grace to continue our journey to be faithful.

**LITURGY OF THE WORD**

In the first reading, Isaiah shares the Lord's promise of gathering all nations before him. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews exhorts them to strengthen themselves and endure their challenges as "discipline." In the Gospel, Jesus is asked if only a few people will be saved. He tells them to strive to enter the kingdom of God through the narrow gate.

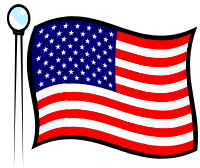



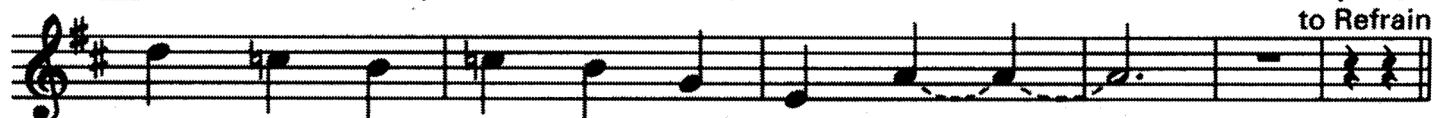
